Colin has lived in Chandler's Ford since 1960 and spent much of his time working for our local community.

After the Hiltingbury schools were built, together with a group of parents, he organised fund raising events that raised the cash to build a swimming school for them. To promote youth activities in Chandler's Ford he worked with the Tyro League to organise football matches for youngsters and was vice chairman of the Chandler's Ford Boys Club for many years. He is now a Governor on Eastleigh College.

After a career in Broadcasting Management (he was the Production Controller of Southern TV and Director of Operations of TV-am) he retired and in 1996 was elected to serve local residents on the Eastleigh Borough Council.

In 2001 he was elected to serve on the County Council and was invited to join its Cabinet as the Executive Member for Communications and Efficiency. He is now overseeing an efficiency programme that is saving £130m, keeping Council Tax low and improving service delivery.

Your Chandler's Ford's County Councillor Colin Davidovitz, who is the County Council's Cabinet member for Efficiency, has played a significant role in this achievement as the Government funding for the Council was reduced

Having had experience as a top Executive managing change in the Broadcasting Industry, his experience helped to oversee the efficiency measures needed to safeguard services by reducing the Council's running costs

Despite a huge reduction in Government funding and protecting local people by freezing Council tax since 2010, all front line services have been protected. The savings made in running costs are being used to bolster departmental budgets to improve care services for our vulnerable adults and children, the maintenance of our roads and the protection of our libraries, arts and museums.

HOW HAS THIS BEEN DONE?

First off, a whole tier of Senior Management was dropped. Departments were merged, staff who left the Council were not replaced and recruitment was stopped. Pay and Councillor allowances were frozen. Staff posts were reduced by 1,800 and only 17 compulsory redundancies were necessary.

By the introduction of IT assisted home-working and changes in working practices, we are able to dispose of 73 specialised office buildings across the County and replace them with 8 strategically located office hubs, making huge savings in overhead expenditure and running costs

The Government says that more reductions will come in order to stabilise the nations finances. The moves taken have put your County Council in a strong position to deal with this.
